UGC /MHRD GUIDELINES: OBJECTIVES

INTRODUCTION: Education is the single most important instrument for social and economic transformation. It is observed that the outcome-based education (OBE) system in higher education is the best way for learners to achieve their goals.

OBJECTIVES: Keeping the changes that are unfolding in higher education as per above, the Human Resource Development Centres (HRDCs) on a war footing shall strive hard:

- (a) to increase access to high-quality education ;
- (b) to organise blended learning programmes (induction, orientation, and refresher courses) for serving teachers with a focus on outcomes rather than output;
- (c) to encourage teachers to develop in-house education-technology incubators that help entrepreneurial start-ups get off the ground by providing them with research, mentorship, and connections, linking them to capital, and inviting them to participate in seminars, symposia, workshops, etc.

Thus, the objectives of the Human Resource Development Centre (HRDC) in light of the above shall be focused on enabling all the faculty members of HEIs, including newly appointed Assistant Professors, to:

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- 1. understand the significance of education in general and higher education in particular in global and Indian contexts;
- 2. understand the linkages between education and economic, socio-economic, and cultural development, with particular reference to the Indian polity, where democracy, secularism, and social equity are the basic tenets of society;
- 3. acquire and improve the basic skills of teaching at the college or university level to achieve the goals of higher education;
- 4. keep abreast of the latest developments in their specific subjects;
- 5. to understand the organisation and management of a college or university and to perceive the role of teachers in the total system;
- 6. Utilise opportunities for the development of personality, initiative, and creativity.

The IQAC encourages faculty members to complete orientation and refresher courses. The IQAC of Gour Mahavidyalaya keeps records of their participation and encourages teachers to take part in these programmes at regular intervals. It is observed that in the academic year 2016–17, three Assistant Professors, in the academic year 2017–18, five Assistant Professors, in the academic year 2018–19, six Assistant Professors, in the academic year 2019-20 five Assistant Professors and in the academic year 2020–21, ten Assistant professors have completed Refreshers/Orientation courses. The authority of the college has given permission in this regard. They have completed refresher and orientation programmes (off-line and online) from UGC/MHRD-recognised or approved institutions or centres.

While FDP programmes provide the opportunity to reorient teachers in emerging fields of study and adapt cutting edge technologies in teaching, RC programmes in specific subjects improve the research potential of teachers, which subsequently enriches the content of their teaching in general. As teachers from Gour Mahavidyalaya, Malda, participated in programmes hosted by Mizoram University, North Bengal University, the University of Mysore, Alagirh Muslim University, Jadavpur University, the University of Burdwan, the University of Calcutta, and the UGC Human Resource Development Centre, Rani Durgawati Vishwavidyalaya, Jabalpur, M.P., among others, they got the opportunity to share their knowledge and return with fresh outputs.

Assistant Professors of Gour Mahavidyalaya, Malda, get the much-needed pan-India perspective on issues of research concern, which is required from the Indian perspective for the development of our beloved nation. FDP programmes are also effective in inculcating the importance of moral education and informing the changing priorities of higher education and the structural aspects of educational institutions in India. Many of us have joined higher education institutions without this fundamental knowledge. Overall, these

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courses have been tremendously beneficial in updating knowledge acquisition and dissemination practises.
