

1. Identification of Advanced and Slow Learners:

The criteria for identifying the Slow and Advanced learners are fixed in Departmental Committee meeting following the norms set down by the Academic Council of the College. The Slow Learners & Advanced Learners are chosen based on the result of the Intern Exam of Semester- I and semester- III as well on the class performance and response of the students.

The annual university result is further consulted to update the existing lists of Slow and Advanced Learners. The progression or demotion of the students are assessed and are placed in the respective Advanced or Slow Learners Group.



a. To address the problems of the Slow Learners and guide and assist them through extra problem solving sessions, material distribution and conduction of examination in their learning process. b. To guide and assist the Advanced Learners to realize their potential and prepared them for pursuit of further studies after the completion of graduation.

3. Proposed Strategies for Slow Learners:

To meet the objective of assisting the Slow Learners the following measures are proposed:

- 1) The learners are usually engaged thrice in a month to share their problems with their teachers. However, depending on the necessity of the learners the mentors/ teachers may increase or reduce the number of classes/ problem solving sessions.
- 2) They are encouraged to speak about their specific problems with the syllabus.
- 3) They are also asked to share whether there is any difficulty for them to adjust with the academic environment of the college as a whole.
- 4) They are also asked to share their problems at home which are severely affecting their study.
- 5) The problems are individually addressed & specific suggestions are provided.
- 6) Books are provided from the department. Sometimes teachers individually assist to the students.
- 7) Special classes are held, materials are provided and links for online learning platforms are shared with the students.
- 8) Students are encouraged for tests to assess their progress. Their answer scripts are checked and corrected. Suggestions are provided.

4. Proposed Strategies for Advanced Learners:

To meet the objective of assisting the advanced learners to get prepared for further studies the following strategies are proposed:

- 1) Special classes are held, materials are provided and links for online learning platforms are shared with the students.
- Advanced students are encouraged to take part in student seminars/ workshops or colloquiums to keep them updated on various advancements in the field of English Studies.
- 3) Advanced Students are encouraged to study beyond their syllabus and books/ materials are shared with them.
- 4) They are especially encouraged to study the history of English literature and that of other literatures such as Sanskrit literature, German or French literature so that they can better prepare themselves to face the entrance exams of different Universities for masters program. The entrance exam questions of different universities are provided to them. It can also help them prepare for the national eligibility tests such as NET while studying in graduation itself.

- 5) The learners are usually engaged thrice in a month to share their problems with their teachers. However, depending on the necessity of the learners the mentors/ teachers may increase the number of classes/ problem solving sessions.
- 6) They are also asked to share their problems at home which are severely affecting their study. The problems are individually addressed & specific suggestions are provided.
- 7) Students are encouraged for tests to assess their progress. Tutorial exams are held. Their answer scripts are checked and corrected. Suggestions are provided.
- 8) The Advanced Students may avail the INFLIBNET facility using the access of the teachers.





Class Attendance of Advanced Students of SEMESTER II






Class attendance of Slow Learners Semester IV

Politics Now

The weird present, plagued with the constant phobia of imminent death has forced us into deeper philosophical and ontological uncertainties. We wake up each morning as if to play dice with Death. One may recall here the cinematographic image of Bergman's The Seventh Seal in which the Knight endeavors to checkmate Death. The hauntology and scare of death tend to corrode all our epistemic foundational planks. Unmooring us, thus, from some of our strongly held political and cultural certainties and triumphalism of modernity, it has led to gloom, anxiety, ennui and terror – a Nietzschean version of nihilism. But is not dejection also an ontological precondition to creatively re-imagine our futures? Who are our sokhas/inmates who can embalm our current Bergmanian 'cries and whispers'? Who can ferry us across this current crisis of disease, global socio-political disorder and death? What lessons can we derive from similar troubles in the past? How can our poets, philosophers, artists and critical thinkers help us rebuild our bare and fragile existence? Does the present crisis also promise a leap to a new political future beyond the torturous visions of the current myopia? Can we think beyond our normative frames of western modernity and capitalist plunder? Can a new culture of faith heal our wounds and re-enchant the world? This colloquium seeks to explore possible pathways in these troubled times.

The outcome of the web-colloquium and panel discussion can be summarized thus:

- a. One primary objective of both the colloquium and the panel discussion was to take stock of the implications of the 'crisis' thrust upon us by the pandemic for sociocultural, intellectual and political spheres. The esteemed speakers and panelists discussed the issues pertaining to the 'crisis' and presented their perspectives about the futures that are to emerge post-pandemic.
- b. Speakers delivered their talk from variety of perspectives- from historical to the literary to the sociological- on the 'crisis' that helped the participants, specially the

students, very much to understand the present 'troubled times' in historical and cultural contexts.

- c. There were deliberations on the thoughts of 'our' thinkers- poets, social and political thinkers such as Tagore or the great poet of Mahabharata- in battling the present 'crisis' and their imagining a new future.
- d. The panel discussion on Politics Now stimulated discussions on the political implication of the present 'crisis', how the authoritarian regimes across the globe are using it to impose their hold and how it also exposes the present capitalist model of development generating hopes of a post-capitalist social order. The panel discussion was extremely helpful in thinking through the politics –both during and after the pandemic.


