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1.The Workshop entitled "NAAC-VISION2021" was organized by the IOAC.Gour 26.04.2017. Mahavidyalaya, Mangalbari, Malda, on Dr. A.K.Sarkar, Principal, Gour Mahavidyalaya, Malda. discussed the main objectives the workshop entitled "NAACVISION2021". Dr.A.K. Sarkar reviewed the notes given by the NAAC Peer team members and discussed the steps of quality assurance in case of timely submission of AQARs, preparation of yearly Budget, and complete yearly Audit.

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#### 2. WORKSHOP: BHARATER SWADHINATA SANGRAME SAHITYER ABADAN:14.08.2016:

Dr. Gopal Mishra, Vice Chancellor, University of Gour Banga, Malda, pointed out how Art and literature was used to spread the message of patriotism and expose atrocities of British. In Anandamath, set during the famine in Bengal, Chattopadhyay highlighted various patriotic acts of and sacrifices made by his characters, ordinary people who left their homes and families to fight against subjection, and in service of the Mother. National song, Bande Mataram, was first published as a poem in this novel as the rallying cry of the characters who used it to give themselves courage and to urge people to fight against the British.

Prof. Sakti Pada Patra, President, Governing Body, Gour Mahavidyalaya, Ex-Principal, Malda Govt. Teachers Training College, discussed how Literature played an important role and was used as a tool of propaganda. Newspapers like Bande Mataram, Jungantar Patrika, and Harijansought to make Indian citizens not only socially and politically aware but also unite them for one common cause. Pamphlets written and distributed across India provided critical information and served as propaganda against the British.

Dr. Apurba Chakraborty, IC, University of Gour Banga, discussed how the Swadeshi movement started mobilizing beyond the literate section. Dr.Chakraborty argued that Rabindranath Tagore was one of the main ideologues of the constructive Swadeshi movement

#### 3. Seminar: International Mother Language Day:21.02.2017

Dr.A.K.Sarkar, Principal, Gour Mahavidyalaya, Malda, discussed the importance of the Day in the Cultural and Linguistic History.

Dr.Sushmita Shome, HOD ,Department of Bengali, Gour Mahavidyalaya, discussed the importance of the day and pointed out ,"Multilingual and multicultural societies exist through their languages which transmit and preserve traditional knowledge and cultures in a sustainable way. International Mother Language Day is observed every year to promote linguistic and cultural diversity and multilingualism. First announced by UNESCO on 17 November 1999, it was formally recognized by the United Nations General Assembly with the adoption of UN resolution 56/262in 2002. Mother Language Day is part of a broader initiative "to promote the preservation and protection of all languages used by peoples of the world" as adopted by the UN General Assembly on 16 May 2007 in UN resolution 61/266, which also established 2008 as the International Year of Languages. The idea to celebrate International Mother Language Day was the initiative of Bangladesh. In Bangladesh, 21 February is the anniversary of the day when the people of Bangladesh fought for recognition for the Bengali language".

Outcome/impact: These seminars/workshop provided opportunity to reorient teachers and students on importance of historical days or events. They get the opportunity to share knowledge and returned with fresh inputs.

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
